

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Greetings of joy and peace in the name of our victorious Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

St. Paul wrote, "We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his." Romans 6:4,5) Jesus said, "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." John 10:10b.

We are surrounded by the signs of Spring and nature coming alive with new life. Winter is receding into the past. Winter, a time of darkness, a time when nature becomes quiet or dormant, a time of snow and winter blasts. Then comes Spring and the announcement of new life.

Consider the signs of Spring. We look about and the snow begins to become a memory, unless there is Spring snow storm. We walked with Him to the "Upper Room," witnessed through the eyes of faith and the Word the institution of Holy Communion, walked with Him to the judgment hall and Calvary, we watched as He hung on the cross for six hours, we heard Him cry out, "It is finished." We watched Him hang His head and die. Taken from the cross, He was laid in a new tomb.

Three days later we went to the tomb and found it empty. The angel said, "Why do you seek the living among the dead, He is not here, He is risen." Jesus had conquered death and rose victorious over our enemies: sin, death and the power of the devil. Through victorious Lord we now have a new life.

Paul tells us that in our Baptism, we were united with Christ in a death like His. He took upon Himself our sins, He made us His own children, Children of the heavenly Father, forgiven and renewed for life. In our Baptism, we rose to new life, a new life in Christ, a new life that rests upon His word, a new life that empowers us by the Holy Spirit to live out our faith to His glory and the welfare of those around us.

The new life in Christ announces that the darkness of sin has been replaced with the brightness of forgiveness, the darkness of despair has been replaced with the morning sunshine of hope, the fear of death has been replaced with new life, an eternal life in Christ. This new life means

we can now have the full life, a life of God's richest blessings, as we prepare for our real home. May you enjoy the freshness of a new Spring and the freshness and joy of the full life that is yours through faith in the resurrected Christ.

Hallelujah, He is risen. He is Risen indeed!

Financial Advice with Purpose
